

Transition to 2021 Curriculum for doctors following a Dual Anaesthetics and ICM CCT Programme

The integration of the two 2021 curricula and the training plans are documented in the [ICM & Anaesthetics Dual CCTs Programme Guidance](#).

ICM is moving all their Stage 1 & 2 doctors in training onto their new curriculum simultaneously in Aug 21 as the new Lifelong Learning Platform (LLP) becomes available, and the NES portfolio is phased out. Those doctors in their Stage 3 final year may choose to remain on the old curriculum as long as they are due to CCT by 31 August 2022, otherwise they will have to move to the new curriculum and LLP.

The transition plan for Anaesthetics is to move to the new curriculum as soon as practicable after Aug 21 – [see the detailed transition plan on the RCoA website](#).

Doctors undertaking **dual training in ICM and Anaesthetics** have a programme that allows attainment of capabilities in both curricula to be gained during their placements. It is anticipated that the move to both new curricula will be done as soon as practicable from Aug 21.

It is appreciated that every doctor has an individual bespoke training plan so precise transition arrangements should be discussed and agreed with the Training Programme Directors to allow as smooth a transition as possible.

It is recognised that this may mean doctors are temporarily on two different curricula, but as ICM moves its portfolio to the LLP, documentation of completion of capabilities in both curricula should be easier to document and record.

Where the CT3 capabilities for the new Stage 1 Anaesthetics Training programme need to be obtained in order to be eligible to enter Higher Specialist Training, we would encourage local initiatives to facilitate this, in whatever manner is suitable to the local trainers, TPDs and Postgraduate Deans.
